CCSD21 shall continue its efforts to improve the design, delivery, and assessment of strong tier one curriculum for all students. In particular, CCSD21 will emphasize enhancements to its reading and language arts curriculum that incorporates increased use of phonemic instruction, academic vocabulary, and increased integrated support for EL learners. In mathematics, an emphasis on increasing quality math workshop techniques with a focus on mastery of math facts and conceptual thinking will be a priority. The district shall make use of multiple data points to assess effectiveness of instruction and student growth and achievement including district local common assessments, fall, winter, and spring administrations of the NWEA MAP assessment, ACCESS for EL learners, and data from the annual administration of IAR assessments. In addition to academically driven instructional improvement, the district will also place increased emphasis on the social-emotional growth of all students through the incorporation of a range of classroom and school based SEL activities.
